

SHERIFF'S REPORT

JOHN LUCAS WILLIAMS, 30, of Dowlletown is charged with domestic assault. His bond is \$3,500 and his court date is March 8.

According to Sheriff Patrick Ray, on Feb. 16 a deputy was dispatched to a residence on Piney Woods Road for a physical domestic. Upon arrival the officer spoke with Williams' ex-wife who said that Williams had assaulted her and her sister, who also lives at this residence. He allegedly pushed and grabbed them causing his ex-wife to sustain scrapes on her knee. The woman's sister also had a large knot with an abrasion on the back of her head. Williams left the scene prior to the deputy's arrival but he was arrested later.

BOBBY F. DUGGIN, 53, of Dowlletown was cited for simple possession of a schedule II drug (Oxycodone). He will make a court appearance on March 1. Sheriff Ray said that on Thursday, Feb. 15 Duggin was found to be in possession of the pills for which he was unable to provide a prescription.

STEPHANIE ANN PIERCE, 42, of Elmwood is charged with being a

fugitive from justice. Her bond is \$75,000 and her court date is Feb. 22. Sheriff Ray said that on Monday, Feb. 12 the jail received two warrants from Warren County, Ky., for failure to appear against Pierce, along with an extradition order to pick her up.

PETER NATHANIEL CLARK, 42, of Sharon Circle, Crossville is charged with being a fugitive from justice. His bond is \$75,000 and his court date is Feb. 22. Sheriff Ray said that on Friday, Feb. 16 a sheriff's department deputy responded to the area of Talpha Drive to check on suspicious persons in a vehicle. Upon arrival he spoke with three persons, including Clark. After checking his driver license through the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), the officer learned that Clark is wanted in Michigan on an active felony warrant. Michigan authorities plan to extradite Clark.

GREGORY WAYNE ROBERTS, 39, of Smithville is charged with a second offense for driving on a revoked license. His bond has been revoked by the judge. His next

court date is Feb. 22. Sheriff Ray said that on Wednesday, Feb. 14 a sheriff's department detective spotted a vehicle traveling after dark without its headlights or tail-lights on. He conducted a traffic stop and spoke with the driver, Roberts.

A computer check revealed that his license were suspended in Lebanon for failure to satisfy a citation in 2006. Roberts also has prior offenses against him in DeKalb County for driving on a revoked license in 2016.

BRANSFORD LEE PATTERSON, 31, of Smithville is charged with driving under the influence. His bond is \$2,000 and his court date is March 8. Sheriff Ray said that on Thursday, Feb. 15 a deputy was dispatched to the 8800 block of Short Mountain Road due to a one vehicle accident involving a 2000 Ford Mustang. Upon arrival he spoke with the driver, Patterson and discovered that he (Patterson) was very unsteady on his feet and his speech was slurred. Patterson submitted to field sobriety tasks but performed poorly. He was then placed under arrest.

Woodard uses stolen credit card to pay bond

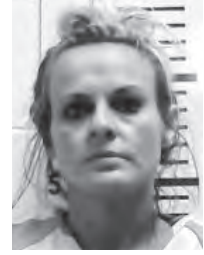
A woman who went on a spending spree with a stolen credit card, her purchases including making a bail bond, has been hit with numerous criminal charges.

The suspect, Robin Lynn Woodard, 32 of Gordonsville is under a \$10,000 bond and will be in court March 1. She is charged with theft of property and fraudulent use of a credit card.

According to Sheriff Patrick Ray, Woodard allegedly used a debit/credit card last October for numerous goods and services. They included a bill payment of \$42 and Straight Talk air time for \$63 for Globaltel in the amount

of \$45, PayPal for \$150, a Pre-paid plus for \$450, and Total Wireless for \$10; VendEngine on three occasions in amounts of \$98, \$90, and \$25, Google Pinger for \$9, and L2GTN Safety for \$424. Her spree also included a bonding agent - Grumpy's Bail Bonding for \$100. It is not known if the bond was for herself or if she bonding someone else out of jail.

On a separate note, this past January Woodard allegedly stole numerous items from another victim including a 30.30 rifle, an M1 30 Carbine Rifle, Cross Bow, 19 inch flat screen TV, Jewelry, digital camera, quilts, sheets, clothes and a Wii console. The total value of the stolen items is \$4,430.

A store clerk has been charged with skimming from the till at the place he worked.
