

# SHERIFF CRIME REPORT

Several arrests were made this past week by the DeKalb County Sheriff's Department. Included in arrests and citations:

**RICKY LEE MASON, 29**, of Lebanon is charged with burglary and theft. His charges come for his entering of a vehicle without permission on Christmas Eve of last year. He reportedly took \$100 from the vehicle and then took \$170 more in cash from the residence.



**TEVIN S. CARTWRIGHT, 20**, is charged with driving on a revoked license. He was pulled over by a sheriff's deputy after the officer noticed he was driving with the wrong license plate on his car. It was at that point the officer found Cartwright had no license and arrested him for driving on a revoked license.



**JULIAN G. SOTO, 36**, is charged with second-offense driving on a revoked license. A deputy observed him not stopping at a stop sign and pulled him over. It was then he found Soto's license had been revoked for a DUI back in 2009.

A drunk driver faces evading charges after he tried to elude deputies
