Proposed Amendments to Bylaws to be voted at the UCEMC Annual Meeting of the Members

No. 1 - Proposed Amendment to Article I, Membership, Section 1.09, Member to Grant Easements to Cooperative and to Participate in Required Cooperative Load Management Programs:

Summary: Proposed Amendment No. 1 would add language to include fiber/telecommunications into existing electric easements.

- No. 2 Proposed Amendment to Article IV, Directors, Section 4.02, Qualifications: <u>Summary</u>: Proposed Amendment No. 2 would add language to include a three (3) year separation required before any person previously employed with the Cooperative could qualify to become a Director.
- No. 3 Proposed Amendment to Article IV, Directors, Section 4.21, "Close Relative" Defined: <u>Summary</u>: Proposed Amendment No. 3 would add language to clearly define "Close Relative" relative to "immediate family" and "immediate in-laws" and would match the language contained in the co-ops Board Policy on nepotism.
- No. 4 Proposed Amendment to Article IV, Directors, Section 4.17, Compensation, Expenses, Temporary Services:

Summary: Proposed Amendment No. 4 would add language to include a three (3) year separation required before any Director could qualify to become an applicant for an Employee position at the Cooperative.
