The only Tiger first down came at the nine-minute mark of the fourth quarter. After deducting the sack yardage from the overall offensive numbers, the Tigers ended up with zero yards of of-

fense.

Trapp said he was disappointed because he thought the team was well-prepared going into the game and there were very few wrinkles in the Panther game they had not trained for during the practice.

"That was getting our job done and we didn't get it done," Trapp said of execution problems in the Stone game.

Helping sink the Tiger hopes were seven sacks that cost them 47 yards. Their top rusher, David Bradford, was limited to just 11

yards on five carries while Aldino went four-for-13 in the air for 40 yards, half of those from a 20-yard completion to Travante Alexander.

There will be no time to lick wounds; however, as undefeated Watertown comes to Smithville

this Friday night for a 7 p.m. kick-off.

"They're the best team we've seen all season," Trapp admitted, saying his squad will need to pick themselves up and get ready to compete. "We're going to have to pack our big boy pants."

Helping jump start the Lady Tigers was a convincing win at Cannon County as they tamed the Lady Lions 6-0. The scoring got underway early as Anna Rachel Blair, off an assist by Robin Pafford, put the ball in the back of the net just two minutes into the game. The scoring parade continued two minutes later when Sophie Hackett scored at the four minute mark.

The Lady Lions were back on their

heels as the Lady Tigers pushed down the pitch, taking a three goal lead at the 10-minute mark when Abbey Parchman scored an unassisted goal. It took eight more minutes for Sophie Hackett to score her second goal of the night off a Taylor Foutch assist to break the game wide open. Anna Rachel Blair then had her second goal of the night off of a Sophie Hackett assist at the 30-minute mark.

Sarah Starnes scored the lone goal of the second half at the 62-minute mark to complete the rout at 6-0 in Woodbury. Meanwhile Lady Tiger goalie Ariel Patterson was a stone wall, making 10 saves in the DeKalb shut out.

The Lady Tigers followed up their win over the Lady Lions with a 2-1 victory at home Thursday night over White County. The win sets them at 3-3-1 overall and 1-0 in their district given their season opening win 8-0 over Upperman.
