The Nashville invite came on the heels of the team earning national bids from the UCA after finishing third in the TSSAA state competition last fall. Warren County followed by winning in the Smoky Mountain Christmas Competition last month.

Coach Elam noted her team has also been active in the area with service projects. The cheerlead-

ers have helped with Habitat for Humanity, performed and participated at Relay for Life, assisted the newly founded Sparkle Squad, and prepared and become involved in Soles for Souls shoe donations, Christmas cards for our veterans and for the oncology floor at Vanderbilt and care packages for troops stationed overseas.

Warren County will be vying for its second straight national championship next month. Last season, Warren County cheerleaders won the Cheersport National championship in Atlanta. On Feb. 8, the current football cheerleaders will set their aim on the UCA National championship.

The event will be held at Disney in Orlando. Coach Elam and the team will spend the rest of the month preparing for the event.
