

Arizona man charged for making illegal ammunition

CHANDLER, ARIZ. (AP) — An Arizona man who sold ammunition to the gunman who carried out the deadliest mass shooting in modern U.S. history was charged Friday with manufacturing armor-piercing bullets, according to court documents.

Unfired armor-piercing bullets found inside the Las Vegas hotel room where Stephen Paddock launched the Oct. 1 attack had the fingerprints of ammunition dealer Douglas Haig, according to a criminal complaint filed in federal court in Phoenix. It says Haig didn't have a license to manufacture armor-piercing ammunition.

Haig has acknowledged

selling 720 rounds of tracer ammunition to Paddock in the weeks before the shooting that killed 58 people.

Tracer bullets contain a pyrotechnic charge that illuminates the path of fired bullets so shooters can see whether their aim is correct.

The criminal charge involves another type of ammunition — armor-piercing bullets.

Haig, 55, told investigators when Paddock bought the ammunition at his home in suburban Phoenix, Paddock went to his car to get gloves and put them on before taking the box from Haig, the complaint said.

"I had no contribution to what Paddock did," Haig told reporters earlier

Friday, adding there was nothing unusual about the type or quantity of ammunition the shooter bought.

"I had no way to see into his mind."

The two armor-piercing bullets found in Paddock's hotel room with Haig's fingerprints had an "incendiary capsule" on their noses, the documents said.

A forensic analysis of those two bullets had tool marks consistent with the equipment in Haig's backyard workshop, according to the complaint.

The complaint said Haig sold armor-piercing bullets in more than 100 instances to customers across the United States, including Nevada, Texas, Virginia, Wyoming and South Carolina.



NASHVILLE (AP) — Tennessee authorities say they're investigating whether Nashville Mayor Megan Barry or others violated criminal laws in her affair with her former security

On Wednesday, Barry revealed the affair with Sgt. Robert Forrest, who has recently retired. She apologized and said she will remain in office and seek to restore people's trust.

TBI spokesman Josh DeVine says Nashville District Attorney General Glenn Funk requested the investigation.

DeVine says some investigation areas include misappropriation of public funds and official misconduct.

Barry said she will fully cooperate and declined further comment, citing the ongoing investigation.

Combined travel expenses between Barry and Forrest exceeded \$33,000 from January 2017 to late October 2017. She said the trips were business-related, nothing illegal happened, and no policies were violated.

Bassett had faced an automatic life sentence required under Tennessee law after being found guilty of first-degree murder in the December 2015 death of 15-year-old Zaeveion Dobson. The jury that convicted Bassett on Dec. 14 also found Williams and Colbert guilty of facilitating the shooting. Sword said during the sentencing hearing that he considered all the defendants "equally culpable."

KNOXVILLE (AP) — One defendant received a life sentence and two co-defendants were given prison terms of more than 100 years each Friday for their roles in the 2015 death of a teenage football player who received national praise for shielding friends from gunfire.

Knox County Criminal Court Judge Steven Sword sentenced Christopher Drone Bassett to life plus 35 years, Richard Gregory

Dobson, who had been a promising football player at Fulton High School in Knoxville, was on a back porch with friends Dec. 17, 2015 when shots were fired. Police said Dobson suffered a fatal gunshot wound while shielding two girls, who were unhurt.

That act of bravery drew national attention when Dobson was praised posthumously by then-President Barack Obama.
