

# Fatal shooting

## Roommate argument turns deadly

A drunken argument between two roommates led to a deadly shooting Tuesday night atop Harrison Ferry Mountain.

Steven Pohl, 57, was shot and killed by his roommate, Gregory Allen Koller, 61, at their remote home. The shooting took place around 6:45 p.m.


"Both of them were armed and both of them had been drinking," said Sheriff's Department chief investigator Marc Martin. "They got into an argument and one of them shot and killed the other. It very well could be a case of self-defense but we want to make sure the evidence portrays that."

Hordes of law enforcement officials converged on the scene at 440 Lewis Road, a dead-end street that runs off Rocky Top Road in a sparsely populated area of the county.

Martin says it appears both men were in possession of a firearm at the time of the shooting. Koller had a rifle while the deceased victim had a handgun.

"The case is still under investigation but no charges have been filed," said Martin, who added Koller was never arrested.

In similar cases in the past, the shooter has not been charged but has had his case taken before the grand jury to see if an indictment is issued. District Attorney General Lisa Zavogiannis said it's too early to say if that will be her course of action in this case, but she said that's how she handles most shootings of this type.


Tennis enthusiasts attempted to serve up a win during Tuesday's McMinnville Board of Mayor and Aldermen meet-
