There were 105 instances of vandalism/ destruction of property with 33 cleared by arrest.

Statistics from McMinnville Police Department show there were 1,438 total offense in 2017 with 51.7 percent cleared by arrest.

There was one murder inside the city limits, the stabbing death of Barry Cole by Wesley Lex Leverett in February 2017. There were no kidnappings and five report-

ed forcible rapes, with one cleared by arrest.

When combining all the theft categories, including shoplifting, there were 489 reported thefts in McMinnville.

That includes 42 motor vehicles stolen.

There were 94 arrests for DUI, 40 for drunkenness, and 14 for disorderly conduct.
