Residents who have accumulated unwanted hazardous materials around their homes can take advantage of Tennessee's free Household Hazardous Waste Collection to be held this coming Saturday, May 19, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Three Star Mall, 1410 Sparta Street.

The event is being sponsored by Warren County government and Tennessee Department of Environment Conservation.

This year's Hazardous Waste Collection is being held in conjunction with Warren County's 14th annual Tarp the Truck event as part of the county's Litter Grant program sponsored

by TDOT. Both events will be held during the same hours and at the same location. The first 100 Warren County vehicles that bring some acceptable household hazardous waste will be provided a free 8x10 foot tarpaulin. According to event coordinator Dennis Baird, the tarp giveaway is part of an effort to reduce litter on Warren County roads.


