Policy discussed about who should work snow days

When it comes to emergency school closings, the Board of Education authorizes Warren Director of County Schools Bobby Cox to close schools in the event of hazardous weather or any other emergency which presents a threat to the safety of students, staff members or school

property. Recently, the board met to discuss this policy, specifically for classified employees and snow days. Classified employees are not teachers, but support staff workers.

Classified staff come in," said Cox. "Teacher's assistants don't come in, but if they are working 12 months like custodians, central office staff, or maintenance, they come in. They're paid on

a salary, but they still work days those because that is part of their time at work. Now, if it is too dangerous, I'll tell everyone not to come in and we still pay them for that time because that's not their fault because

that's the decision we made here."

If school custodians don't make it to school on a snow day, they are docked that day or they have the choice to take a personal or vacation day. However, Cox said typically principals try to work with them or allow them to make up the


