Boyd graduates 16

After Boyd Christian School graduates received their diplomas Thursday night, board of directors chairman Gary Hancock stepped to the podium to offer some parting advice.

"Treat every day like it's the best day ever and realize how precious every day is," said Hancock, who pointed out life will fly by quickly. "I've noticed that I've become the oldest one at family get-togethers."

Hancock's words punctuated a ceremony that saw 16 Boyd seniors earn their degrees and become high school graduates. It took place at Central Church of Christ.

Trent Key delivered the commencement speech and emphasized the power of positive thinking. He also told graduates the importance of taking care of their bodies and noted he gained weight, the so-called "Freshman 15," during his first year of college. Key said long hours of studying and losing sleep can also bring negative consequences.

Key also stressed the importance of spirituality. "Always put God first," said Key. "No matter where you go in life, remember God is the reason you have life. ... The most valuable life you could ever hope to live is one devoted to Him."
