Brock, with assistance from his Venture Crew members, will be offering free, 10-point vehicle inspections at the following locations:

• FRIDAY, MAY 11 at Napa from 4-8 p.m.

• SATURDAY, MAY 12 at Napa from 8 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-2 p.m.

• FRIDAY, MAY 18 at Kidd Ford from 4-8 p.m.

• SATURDAY, MAY 19 at Kidd Ford from 8 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-3 p.m.

Inspections will include seatbelts, tires, headlights, turn signals, brake lights, back up lights, wipers, blades, horn, and fluids. Brock has been working with Tennessee Highway Patrol Lt. Billy Prater, who is the project beneficiary, to incorporate child car seat inspections.

"The hardest part about this was finding locations. I contacted a lot of businesses that told me they couldn't allow it because of liability issues. I'm grateful to Kidd Ford and Napa for allowing me to host these, very grateful. "
