

# Rubley seeks reelection as District 8 commissioner

Hi, I'm Scott Rubley and I am a candidate for reelection to the Warren County Commission, District 8. Born in Warren County, I have lived my entire life in the Irving College community.

I attended Irving College Elementary and graduated from Warren County Senior High in 1989. I have been married to my wife, Vanessa, for more than 25 years. We have one son, Zachary, who is 24.

God has blessed me with more than I could ever deserve and I don't know where I would be without his guidance. Together, with my wife, son, father and brother, we operate Rubley's Nursery. Dad started the business in the early '70s, and we have continued to grow the business.

I am currently serving in the following committees: Financial Management, Education, County Corrections Partnership, and Agriculture Extension

(chairman). In my first term, we have seen many accomplishments. I will list a few. We have completed three school projects, Irving College School addition, Bobby Ray gym, and a new Wellness Center at the high school. We have built a county morgue, and are in the early stages of building additions and improvements at Bobby Ray, and will soon begin a project at West Elementary which includes updates on existing structures and new construction. The funding has already been appropriated for these projects.

We have added seven new corrections officers at the jail. We have increased funding for all the volunteer fire departments. We have given annual raises to county employees, and working with the Department of Education, have been able to provide raises for teachers and support staff. We have seen an annual increase in

the education budget that averages about \$1 million per year. And the list goes on.

We have done all of these things without raising the property tax. I realize that through reassessment, virtually everyone's taxes have increased. I have done everything possible to see that the tax levy has remained the same without interfering with progress. I hope you agree this list of accomplishments is progress.

The economy is doing well and the new construction in the county reflects that. Because of that we anticipate a substantial increase in tax revenue in the next fiscal year. I believe we can continue into future years without increasing taxes if we manage carefully.

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Pastor Owens also pointed out God's word is clear in Matthew 28:18-20 when it states: And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. First Baptist Church also strives to evangelize locally through its Beyond Our Walls program by canceling services on campus on Sunday nights to bring church to four different apartment complexes including Buckingham, Green Acres, Orchard View and Yager Apartments. Members set up with curriculum, crafts and games to teach children about Jesus. This is offered throughout the summer until Aug. 5.

As far as what to expect during a typical First Baptist service, it includes music, singing, fellowship, prayer and then a sermon.

"The thing that makes Southern Baptist as unique as it is, is that they are a people of The Book," said Owens. "We are about getting to the Word of God and allowing that Word to transform and equip us ... to be about the work that Christ has called us to do and that is go and make disciples and to reach the world."


