Bobby Edwards and Billy Joe Crouch spent the least with Edwards spending nothing while Crouch spent \$1,886. Crouch's greatest expenditure was \$600 on signs.

In the race for county executive, the spending is varied more widely with Terry Bell's reported expenditures being \$7,980, specifically \$3,742 on signs and sign materials. Jimmy Haley reported spending \$5,713 with \$1,750 on signs and \$746 on radio ads.

Ray Hixson spent \$4,369. He spent the most on advertising materials, shelling out \$3,036 while Allie Marie Hyatt only reported spending \$135 during this reporting period.

In the race for register of deeds, Wes Williams, who won the Democratic Primary in May, spent \$5,990 during this reporting period with \$3,198 going toward signs. That number far surpassed Tim Grandey, who reported spending \$983. Danny Cummings spent \$2,587. He too, spent the most on signs, spending \$1,573.

clerk race, Casi Powell Cantrell, winner of the Democratic Primary, reported spending \$2,216. Cantrell spent \$579 on signs, pens and promotional materials. Chris Cope followed behind spending \$1,721 with \$778 on signs.

As for the two candidates for trustee, incumbent Darlene Bryant outspent her challenger Anita Nunley by \$743. Bryant spent a total of \$1,437, while Nunley reported spending \$694.

Wellness Center will need temporary home

The city of McMinnville is seeking a building to rehouse its Civic Center activities, including the Wellness Center, when renovation of the facility begins.

"We are looking for a building to rent for two years," said city administrator Bill Brock, during a Parks and Recreation Committee meeting. "I don't care if it's an open space or at the mall. We are looking for an empty facility that has bathrooms. If you know a building that's

available, let us know."

The statement was made during a city Parks and Recreation Committee meeting to review its proposed budget for fiscal year 2018-19.

While exact dimensions were not given, JC Penney was given as an appropriate size. JC Penney was simply used as an example for size.

"So you are going to go somewhere temporarily?" asked Alderman Ben Newman.

Brock replied, "We are looking for some place. I didn't think it would be that difficult to find, but it has been."

The city is awaiting bid documents from Hart, Freeland and Roberts Design that are expected at the beginning of August. Within the proposed project is renovation of the existing facility and construction of two additions. The firm estimates renovation and both expansions will take 14 months, if the building is shut down during the project.

No final decisions have been made on the proposed renovation.
