Despite app, jail population not becoming a 'Nightmare'

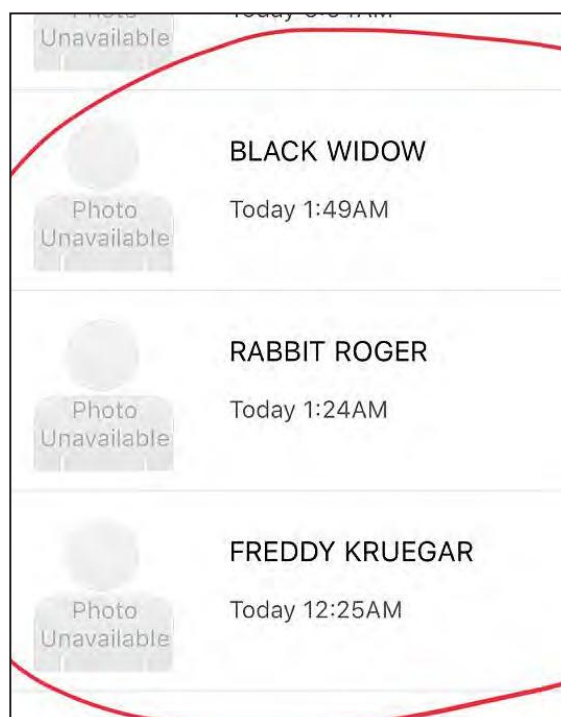

If you pay attention to Mobile Patrol, getting locked up at Warren County Jail has become a real nightmare.

Sheriff Jackie Matheny says a training exercise is responsible for some movie character names being posted on the Mobile Patrol app as new inmates getting booked at the jail. Matheny confirmed Friday that horror film villain Freddy Kruegar of "Nightmare on Elm Street" fame is in fact not an inmate at the jail.

Matheny said the names inadvertently went live during employee training and no confusion was intended.

Several people questioned how the fictitious names became posted on the app and wondered if the site had been hacked. It was also asked if people could provide any name when being booked at the jail to avoid their real name being posted on Mobile Patrol.

His healing started when he watched a video online of McKenzie in the hospital bravely taking steps toward recovery.

"I reached out to her mother," said Miller. "I went to a benefit they were having for McKenzie. I got to meet her, her mother, grandmother, and the whole family. They are great people. It was a wonderful experience. I think that's been the most

rewarding thing that has ever happened to me here. Seeing her. When that wreck happened, I didn't think she was going to make it. God works miracles and that's one. McKenzie is a miracle."

The two have stayed in close contact since 2011. McKenzie recently graduated high school with Miller in attendance.

What happens when the lights and sirens stop for Miller? He wants to pursue some leisure time.

"I'm going to do some fishing. I got a little remodeling I want to do. I'm still going to bike rallies. We like to ride. When I go to rallies, we set up as vendors. We sell hats, flags, license plates, jewelry and all kinds of stuff. I've been doing that for about 20 to 25 years. I enjoy doing that. It's a hobby."

His official sendoff from the department will be a farewell dinner Monday evening.
