New book compares county's past to present

Magness Library has collaborated on a book with Krystal Tanner and Cody Prince to capture a history of evolution.

"Warren County (Then & Now)" features 85 historic photographs from the Brady-Hughes-Beasley Achieves. The collection, donated to the library for preservation, delivers a peek into the past.

Tanner provided the present photos and Prince edited the book.

"I think everyone will be thrilled when they see this book." said Magness Library director Brad

Walker. "It has a lot of history. Some of that history has been forgotten and replaced with what stands there now. Krystal did an excellent job in taking the present pictures. It's amazing how much things have changed."

The photos date back to the late 1800s, giving a full time lapse of images. In Warren County's more than 210 years, some things have changed while other places have remained constant.

"We went through 3,000 to 4,000 photos in the archives to find the ones we wanted to use," said Walker. "It was quite an endeavor. The book also contains information about the sites. If you are a history buff, you're going to love this

Looking back on how times have changed in this community, people will realize how far society has come. Pictures of the farmers market to the old railroad bridge at Pepper Branch Park show how structures stand the test of time, or show their modifications.

The book guides readers into all different parts of the town. From Irving College to Morrison, pictures and information provide readers with the chance to see what happened and why buildings and roads were assembled.

'Warren County (Then & Now)" would not have happened without the

Brady-Hughes-Beasley Archives. It contains over 33,000 photographs taken by Anthia Brady-Hughes, Willie Hughes, and Joe Hughes Beasley. The family passed down the love of photography and luckily for the citizens of Warren County, they kept the history alive to be passed on to the next generation.


