WCPI holding live election coverage

Public radio 91.3 WCPI returns to election coverage Thursday night with the live broadcast starting at 6:30 p.m. and continuing until races of local interest are decided.

"WCPI has covered every local election since this non-commercial station debuted on the air more than 20 years ago, and we look forward to continuing that tradition," said Mary E. Cantrell, the station's program director. "Along with the candidate forums we co-sponsor with *Southern Standard*, and the live

reporting we've done on the early voting process, we're working to fulfill our mission of public service and voter education."

Candidates are invited to stop by the WCPI election desk in the hallway just outside the Warren County Election Commission office to share their thoughts with voters, Cantrell noted. Call-ins from voters and their campaign officials will be accepted, but airtime priority will be given to those who show up in person.

"As in past elections, we want 91.3 to be the

prime source of up-to-the-minute ballot results," she continued. "Speed and accuracy are our top goals as we broadcast the tallies as soon as they are released by the election administrator."

In addition to the Warren County races, WCPI will provide coverage of the major statewide and Congressional primaries.

Warren County Schools get \$4,000 grand prize

Warren County Schools was presented with a \$4,000 check by Lean Frog representative Sherri Headrick as its grand prize winner.

"Our judges were very impressed with your comprehensive STEM program, but also with the way you partnered with business and industry," said Headrick. "We like the strategic way you went about developing the program and making it sustainable.

Entries are judged by their creativity, the impact on students, but also the sustainability that is benefiting your local industry through your Mechatronics and robotics lab."

Headrick went on to explain Warren County competed against other Tennessee entries, along with those from Alabama and Louisiana.

"My husband is from Alabama and I'm from Waverly, Tennessee so I was glad someone from Tennessee won," said Sherri with a chuckle.

Director of Schools Bobby Cox recognized Career and Technical Education director Tracy Risinger for her contributions to the STEM program.

"Tracy has done a great job expanding and gathering grants and more equipment for the labs," said Cox. "We now have robotics simulators in all

elementary schools so we have to train our teachers on that this summer."

School Board member Bill Zechman asked Risinger to give a summary of the grants she's been responsible for gathering that have saved Warren County taxpayers money.

"The Mechatronics grant was \$295,000 back in 2012, then I got \$120,000 to upgrade Phyllis Britton the following year and \$200,000 for STEM on Wheels through Perkins Reserve Grants," said Risinger.

After participating in a recent, two-week robotics training program, Risinger says it's an exciting time for STEM in Warren County. The School Board and Risinger look forward to student robotics teams competing in national competitions at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.
