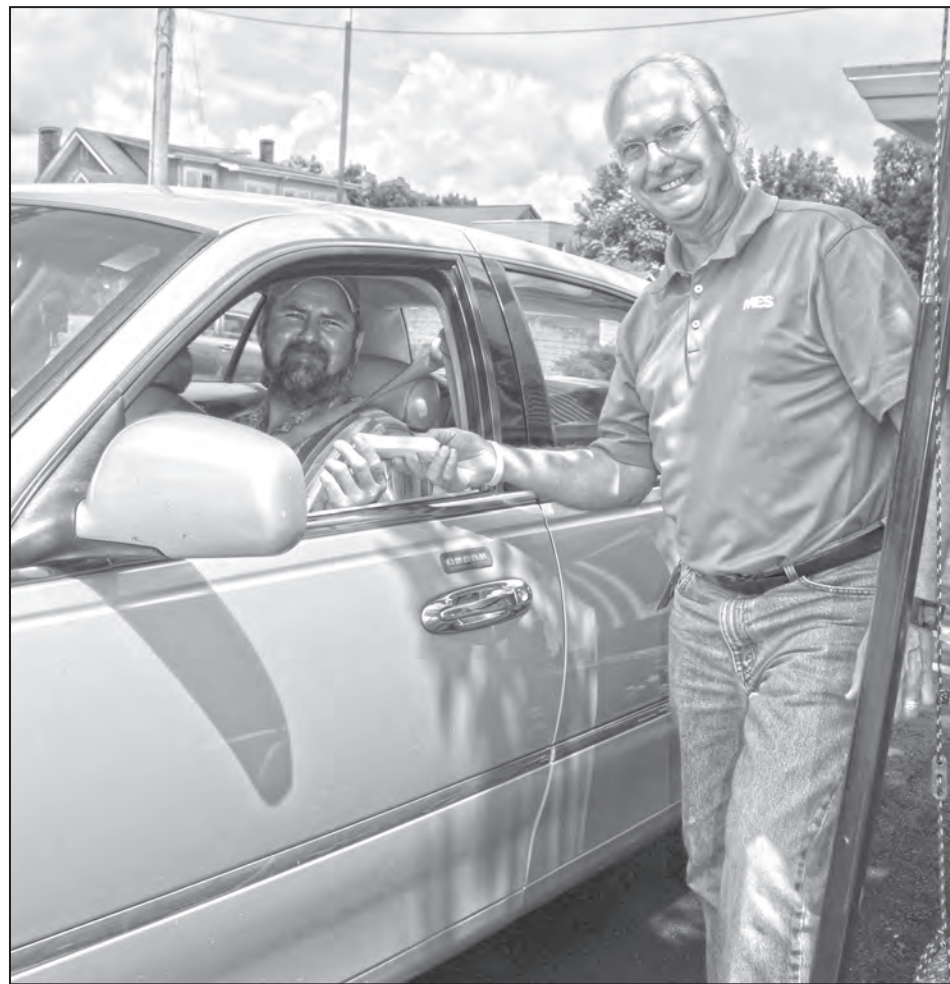


Recharge with ice cream

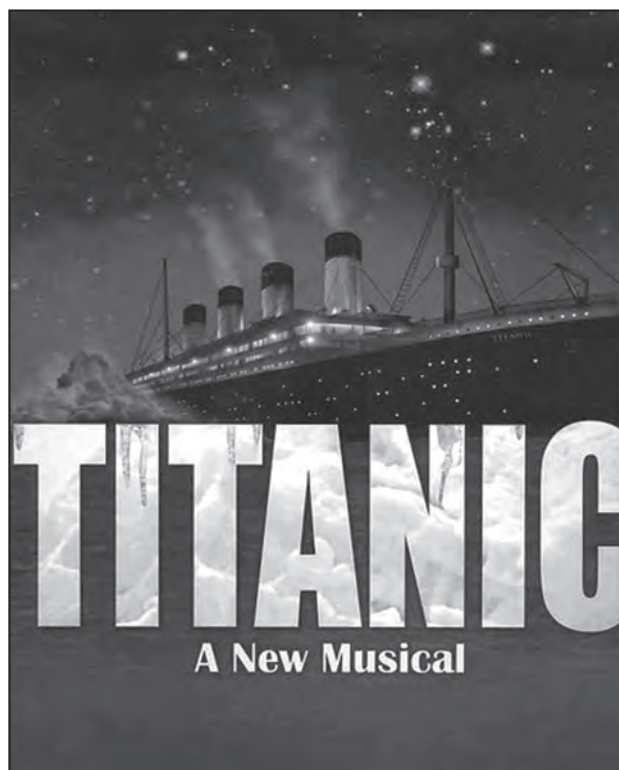
