Wood continued to build the lead after the break, getting a back tap on a tight shot at the net for a point to spark a six-point run. By the time Wood notched an ace, Warren County led 9-2.
Sarah Sharpe momentarily stopped the scoring with a kill for Covenant, but Jennings and Reno responded with spikes of their own for Warren County.
Wood added two more points on push shots, surprising the Covenant back line as the Lady Pioneer setter opted to make scoring plays instead of passes.
She went back to passing late, setting up Beth Vaughn for a big slam on the outside to make it 23-10. Wanamaker added an ace to get to the brink of victory, which came when Covenant hit a wide shot on its final return.
Monday ended with Warren County coming up on the wrong side of a three-set match against Coffee County. The Lady Pioneers fell 24-26, 25-19 and 19-25. It came just two days after losing to the Lady Raiders in a similar fashion in the Coffee County playday.
“It was another tough loss. It was the second time we have gone to three games against them,” said Rogers, who saw her team bounce back with a 25-9, 25-8 win Saturday against Cumberland County. “We are so closely matched that most of the games were point-for-point. The girls’ intensity stayed high throughout the match.”
“I think what got us is the lack of complete chemistry on the court. A lot of these girls have never played with each other before. It’s going to take us a few more games to get that chemistry.”
Warren County got a chance to gel Tuesday when it was back on its homecourt against Cumberland County. Results were unavailable at press time. The Lady Pioneers will travel to Rhea County Thursday for a 4:30 p.m. matchup with the Lady Eagles.
