Lee and Dean to face off in October for 3 debates

NASHVILLE (AP) — Republican Bill Lee and Democrat Karl Dean are slated to face off in three Tennessee governor's race debates in October.

According to a Lee campaign news release, the debates will be Oct. 2 at the University of Memphis; Oct. 9 at the Eastman Employee Center in Kingsport; and Oct. 12 at a location in Nashville to be deter-

Dean's campaign wanted to go head-to-head in more than just the three debates.

Lee's campaign pointed out that the two already shared the same stage during eight forums before their Aug. 2 party primary elections, albeit alongside other candi-

Both candidates were invited to a Southern Standard/ WCPI political forum Oct. 1 at Warren County Administrative Offices.

Lee is chairman of a Franklin mechanical contracting, facilities and home services company. Dean is a former Nashville mayor. They are competing to succeed Republican Gov. Bill Haslam, who is hitting term limits.

NASHVILLE (AP) — Ed King, a former guitarist for Lynyrd Skynyrd who helped write several of the group's hits including "Sweet

Home Alabama," has died in Nashville, Tennessee, according to a family friend. He was 68.

Scott Coopwood said King died Wednesday due to cancer. Funeral arrangements had not yet been announced Thursday.

King joined the band in 1972 and was part of its first three albums with its distinct three-guitar sound.

He is credited on several of Lynyrd Skynyrd's songs, including "Saturday Night Special" and "Workin' for MCA," and his voice can be heard providing the opening count on "Sweet Home Alabama." The song was a response to Neil Young's songs "Southern Man" and "Alabama," which focused on the Southern white man's rise on the back of slavery.

The song is now considered a Southern anthem played often at sporting events and was used for a time on Alabama license plates.

DALTON, GA. (AP) — A police chase that began in Tennessee has ended with the shooting of a shoplifting suspect in Georgia.

News outlets cite a Georgia Bureau of Investigation release saying a man and a woman were reported shoplifting at a Bradley County, Tennessee, store and accused of threatening employees with a handgun Wednesday. Deputies from three counties gave chase, as the suspects crossed state

When Georgia troopers used a maneuver to stop the suspects' car, the male driver surrendered, but the woman grabbed the wheel and fled on her own. When authorities conducted the same maneuver on her, police say she got out with two handguns, at which point multiple officers shot her.

It's unclear to what agencies those officers belonged.

Her condition hasn't been released. No officers were injured.

Cotten gets approval for job

Justin Cotten has been officially approved as Warren County government's new Finance Department director.

"I'm excited for this opportunity. I can't lie. I'm a little nervous. It's a lot of responsibility," said Cotten.

The department oversees revenues of approximately \$86 million a year.

Cotten says he's looking forward to working with the Warren County Commission. The oath of office will be administered to the 24 commissioners Aug. 27.

Cotten graduated from County High Warren School.

"I look forward to working with Mr. Haley," he said of County Executiveelect Jimmy Haley. "We have to work closely together, not only because we share a space but because of the overlap. Two people have to sign checks. I haven't really spoken to him much since I graduated high school. He was a teacher of mine. I look forward to working with him in keeping the county going in the right direc-

Linda Hillis hired Cotten in April 2012 when the 81 Act was adopted. She is retiring, and he was officially appointed as her replacement Monday by the full Warren County Commission.

As director, he plans on redistributing the work-load within the department.

"First, I'm going to restructure the workload. It's what Linda did when I came onboard. She gave me responsibilities. Över time, when I became comfortable with the duties I had, I took on more. That's the first place I'm going to go, a restructuring of the workload."

Financial Management Committee members mentioned during his hiring process an assistant to the director is needed, a realization that Hillis had a tremendous workload. However, the budget for fiscal year 2018-19 was approved without any additional funds for that position.

"I'm going to see about spreading the workload within the office," said Cotten.

A hiring process will begin for two employees. With Cotten being hired from within the department, someone is needed to replace him. Also, an employee is retiring. Those two open positions will be advertised in Friday and Sunday's edition of the Southern Standard.
