Wildcat running back Briasen Corn broke six tackles on a long touchdown run to open the scrimmage, only to see it called back on a penalty. Corn found paydirt on the first play of his team's second drive, scoring from 37 yards out.

Quarterback Ben Fulton followed with four touchdown passes, connecting with Jakobe Thomas at the end of the first quarter before hitting Matthew Ross once and Hunter Jewell twice for scores in the second. All three scoring strikes in the second quarter covered 35 yards or more, when Tullahoma was able to find wide-open receivers down field.

Kobe Burks added Tullahoma's final score on a 29-yard run to open the third quarter.

"There's a lot of first-time players on defense. They haven't played a lot of football. It's where we are right now," said Moore.

Sophomore quarterback Clay Thompson, who started and played the first six series, set his sights deep for Eli Buchanan. Thompson's bomb down the middle was tipped by a leaping safety, but Buchanan was able to dive and haul in the 40-yard reception.

Taylor ripped off a 25-yard run on the next

play, then Raven Lewandowski finished off the drive on a jet sweep covering five yards that crossed the goal line. Taylor added the two-point conversion, giving Warren County an early 8-7 lead.

The Pioneers had late highlights defensively. Cain Haywood stopping Tullahoma on a fourth-and-goal at the Tullahoma 2 and Hunter Burch recovering a fumble in the fourth quarter.
