



GENERAL SESSIONS

Judge Bill Locke ruled on the following cases Tuesday in General Sessions Court. Megan Gudger was ordered to serve seven days of a 30-day sentence for public intoxication. Kelli Deann Smartt was ordered to serve 48 hours of an 11-month, 29-day sentence and undergo a mental health assessment for domestic assault. Becky Williams was ordered to serve 10 days of an 11-29 sentence for violating an order of protection. In separate cases, Daniel Lee Adams and Ricky E. Callahan had probation revoked for violation of probation. Ordered to serve jail time for violation of probation were Jesse Lee James (30 days), Zachary Shane

Walters (75 days), Julian Martinez (45 days), and Anthony Jose Mendez (48 hours). Austin Mansfield was released on time served and will be allowed to serve the rest of his 11-29 sentence on probation for vandalism. Restitution is to be determined. Charles Waylon Alexander was given 11-29 probation and a \$750 fine for simple possession. Shane Anthony Butcher was ordered to serve 60 days and pay a \$750 fine for possession of meth and violation of probation. In separate cases, Carri Ann Connolly, John Christopher Elrod, and Jessica Leverett were ordered to serve 30 days of 11-29 sentences and pay

\$750 fines for possession of meth. Charity Fults was given 11-29 probation and 24 hours public service work for theft. Whitley Grissom was ordered to serve 33 days of an 11-29 sentence and pay a \$900 fine for joyriding, possession of meth, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Richard Henagar was ordered to serve 30 days of an 11-29 sentence and pay a \$1,000 fine for possession of meth and simple possession. Rance Higgins had probation revoked, although he can be furloughed to rehab, for violation of probation, simple possession, and contributing to the delinquency of a child.

Jacob Wesley Johnson had probation revoked and was ordered to serve his sentence for violation of probation, criminal trespass, and two counts of shoplifting. He was ordered to pay restitution. Michael S. Vandyne was allowed to enter the second chance program for domestic assault. James Earl Wells Jr. was ordered to serve 10 days of a six-month sentence and fined \$750 for simple possession. Reanna Wolters was given 11-29 probation, ordered to pay \$19 restitution, and told to stay out of Dollar General for shoplifting.
