Tramel threw for 310 yards and four touchdowns in last year's game, part of a season where he led the TSSAA in passing yards. The senior signal caller has 426 yards through two games this year, with Airius Trice (17 catches, 211 yards, TD) and Malachi Burns (9 catches, 138 yards, 2 TDs) serving as his top targets.

The offense doesn't need Tramel to do as much this year. Caleb Marsh has emerged as a running threat, piling up 242 yards already.

Moore knows the Shelbyville offense will be a challenge.

"They're a good team – a really good offensive team," said Moore. They make you defend the whole field. They don't have weak spots on offense."

Warren County is coming off a tough outing offensively, finishing with season lows in yards and points against Cookeville. Becoming more versatile has been the focus all week, with Moore knowing the Pioneer running attack would be more lethal with the threat of throwing being present.


"We've been working

on the passing game and spreading the field. We have to get better with our perimeter game," said Moore. "We have guys who can catch the ball. We have to protect the quarterback and make them comfortable with some throws."

"We're not good enough to be a one-dimensional team against good teams. We can't just line up and run it. We have to be able to throw the ball in good situations, not when the defense relaxes because they know what is coming."

Clay Thompson completed 5-of-15 passes last week, while Eric Haywood continued his strong season with another 100-yard outing on the ground. CJ Taylor, who played through an ankle injury last week, should be back to 100 percent to give the Pioneer offense another weapon Friday.

The first home game will also serve as homecoming for Warren County. A parade will be held downtown at 1:30 p.m. Before kickoff, the game ball will be delivered via a helicopter. Fans are asked to keep the track clear while the helicopter lands and leaves.


