Resolution passes to allow public comment

Public comment will be allowed during Warren County committee meetings after a resolution was passed requiring it.

The resolution

passed Monday night by the full Warren County Commission. It states visitors to committee meetings will be allowed to speak. It passed 23-1. Commissioner Michael Martin voted against it.

Martin lies at the heart of the reason for the measure

to be considered. During a county Health and Welfare Committee meeting May 8 to discuss Warren County Animal Control Adoption Center, refused to allow a visitor to speak. As chairman at that time, he had the authority to ignore the visitor.

According to the resolution passed Monday, a period of time for public comment at each and every committee meeting" will be allowed by the chairman of that committee.

However, the resolution does not outline how much time will be given or when.

The "chairperson of each committee shall make a good-faith effort to permit and incorporate the public comment of each visitor to the meeting, yet shall also be charged with avoiding undue delay and shall be vested with the authority

to suspend public comment when the chairperson determines it is necessary."

No other county commissioners have refused to recognize a visitor and allow them to speak during committee meet-
