## LIBRARIES



DeKalb County has two public libraries, one located in downtown Smithville and one in Alexandria.

**Justin Potter Library**, located on the square in Smithville, has a

selection of over 20,000 books, over 1,500 audiobooks, DVD's and VHS tapes for both adults and youth to enjoy. Community newspapers, along with The

Tennessean, are available, along with magazines, electronic media, computer and internet access, with access to the library from your home or office.



They also have a genealogy and history room with a large collection of census records, family histories, land records, local history and cemetery records just to name a few. Visitors can make copies there, fax services and take a TWRA exam appointment. They have voter registration forms, tax forms and Notary Public services.

The library has several events throughout the year, such as Older American Day, Summer Reading Program and a party,

along with holiday events, after school programs, author book signings, computer classes, Dolly Parton's Imagination Station, outreach programs, and special programs and special programs throughout the year for all ages.
