Valerie June Hockett

With her eclectic blend of folk, soul, country and R&B music, Valerie June

Hockett is making a name for herself in music worldwide. She considers herself a songwriter first, and stands apart from the crowd as

she blurs the lines between genres and eras of sound. Rolling Stone magazine calls her "unstoppable" and it is hard to disagree.

She has performed at Carnegie Hall, the Kennedy Center, the White House and has impressed television audiences with performances on the Tonight Show, The Late Show, Austin City Limits and many more. Whether in New York or Australia, Hockett is a true performer with a sound and presence that is all her own.

Kacy Rodgers

Postgraduate School in Monterey, Calif. Captain Zacharzuk had eight major battle group and numerous out-of-area deployments while stationed aboard five different ships including frigates, destroyers, and aircraft carriers and two seagoing command staffs.

Zacharzuk's tours ashore included Instructor at the Surface Warfare Department Head School in Newport,

Rhode Island and planned and executed OPSAIL 200, the first sailing of the USS Constitution in 116 years. His last duty assignment was as the senior military assistant for the assistant Secretary of Defense.

Following retirement, Zacharzuk was employed to lead and manage programs for Exxon/Mobil Oil Corporation.
