The park mixes action-packed water thrill rides and crowd-pleasing attractions to create delightful and exhilarating entertainment for the whole family.

Some of the park's biggest features include the Acapulco Cliff Dive, the Mega Wedgie, and the Pipeline Wave. The Acapulco Cliff Dive is a "free-fall" slide that shoots riders down at monstrous high-speeds. Those more daring can test their fears on the 277-foot Mega Wedgie that includes a 64-foot free fall. One of the newer attractions include the 42-foot Pipeline Wave that shoots riders up the sides at breathtaking speeds.
