Midwest City offers fun and affordable golf at public courses

Warm summer weather is here. And that means it's time to dusty off the golf clubs and hit the greens.

John Conrad Regional Golf Course, 711 S. Douglas Blvd. in Midwest City, offers a superb and affordable experience for golfers of all ages and abilities.

The 18-hole public course lies on 160 acres of challenging tree-lined roughs, meandering

creeks, beautiful water features and rolling hills. With bermuda grass fairways and bentgrass greens, John Conrad holds up against Oklahoma's extreme weather year round.

"This is a very scenic course with trees lining all of the holes," said Mickey Lloyd, golf course clerk. "Our maintenance staff has been here for years and they do a great job."

The public golf course also features a full-service pro shop, snack bar, 3,000-square-foot tournament pavilion and practice facility for driving, putting and chipping.

Midwest City keeps fees competitive with other courses in the metro. Standard green fees are \$25 with discounts for seniors and military members (\$16.50), junior golfers (\$6), and off-peak hours (\$9 on Mondays). A golf cart rental costs \$14. The course also offers annual memberships.

John Conrad is also popular spot for corporate events and annual charity tournaments.

"A lot of the groups have been holding their tournaments here for years," said Lloyd. "I think they like our friendly staff here. We try to make it
