Street Fest kicks
off October 13*

The fifth annual Mid-America Street Fest is Oct. 13 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. in Charles J. Johnson Central Park in Town Center Plaza at SE 29th and Mid-America Boulevard.

The fall festival is hosted by Midwest City Parks and Recreation and features carnival games and rides, inflatables, an Extreme Animals Petting Zoo, pony rides, a children's tent with arts and crafts activities, food trucks and shopping vendors.

The Boy Scouts' Monkey Bridge will be on site to test balancing skills. Carnival rides include ultimate bungee, the wrecking ball ride and Pirate's Revenge.

Live entertainment features local bands and artists including New Time Zones, The Mystery Dates, New Shoes Band, Richelle Sigrist and Amanda Cunningham. The performers will be taking the stage between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Admission is free, and tickets for games and rides can be purchased for \$1 each or an all-day wristband is \$18. Pony rides are \$5 each.
