Chaney shines for Spartans

The two-way standout is a positive force: 'I like to bring the team up with me'

It might be more fitting if the Saraland football equipment guy issued a hard hat to junior linebacker-running back Adam Chaney instead of a helmet. It would match the approach he has to playing the game, regardless of what position he might find himself playing.

"He's just going to be a junior but it seems like he's been here forever," Saraland head coach Jeff Kelly said of Chaney. "He has probably started every game since he walked into the high school as a ninth-grader. Adam is the kind of guy who doesn't say a whole lot but he shows up every day ready to work — work to get better, ready to improve.

"He's got tremendous physical ability and he's shown a knack on the defensive side of the ball for the first couple of years. Now he's a guy who's going to factor into our plans offensively. Coming up, he spent some time at running back as a sophomore but I think he has the potential to do some good things on both sides of the ball. He's been playing a bunch.

"He's an outstanding young man, outstanding in the classroom. He also is a guy who has gotten a bunch of offers throughout the offseason, but if you showed up and watched him practice or work out or whatever you wouldn't see it. He doesn't carry that on his sleeve at all. He just shows up ready to work."

It is Chaney's complete attitude, not just his hard work, that makes him a special player, Kelly said.

"I don't know that I've ever seen him have a bad day," said Kelly. "Of all the things that kids have to sort through in this day and time, he's a kid that strolls through with a smile on his face every day. I can't think of a time, and I can't think of a better compliment you can give a young man — especially one that is going into the 11th grade — but I don't know that I've ever had to say anything to him about effort or working hard or anything like that. That's just been a given. He comes from a great family, great parents and he just loves ball."

Chaney, 6-foot-2 and weighing 227 pounds, said he enjoys the game and always wants to be a player who leaves everything he has on the field, whether that's in practice or on a Friday night. What he wants, he said, is

to be viewed as a leader for the Spartans. "Although I'm a junior this year I see myself as a senior in terms of maturity," he said. "I like to bring the team up with me, to keep everybody up. I like
