Noted Evangelist, Writer, and Apologist will speak at Bethlehem Baptist Church


Alex McFarland, noted speaker and apologist, will be speaking at Bethlehem Baptist Church, 7500 NC Hwy 127N, Taylorsville, NC, on Saturday, March 3, from 1 to 5pm, and Sunday, March 4, from 9 to 11:30am.

One of the leading figures in apologetics, McFarland has been interviewed by Billy Graham, James Dobson, The New York Times, The Washington Post, Chuck Colson, and CBS, Fox and NBC news.

In 2000, through the 50-States-50-Days Tour of Truth, McFarland and his ministry conducted a crusade that made appearances in every state. The crusade across America included 64 evangelistic services and became the subject of his first book, followed by *STAND: Core Truths You Must Know* for an Unshakable Faith, released in 2005.

Since October of 2004, he has been on the staff of Focus on the Family, traveling and speaking before various audiences, writing for periodicals, organizing apologetics conferences and speaking to the media on topics relating to the Christian world

Eighteen students representing Alexander County's elementary and middle schools took the stage at Alexander Central Auditorium on Monday, February 12, 2018, to compete for the top honor of Spelling Bee Champion. A third-grade student from Bethlehem Elementary School, Carter Payne, emerged as the 2018 Alexander County Spelling Bee Champion. Brianna Jimison, a fifth-grade student from Bethlehem Elementary School placed second in the county-wide event. The competition was won with the words influenza and oolong. Students successfully spelled words like retrospective, chinchilla, pueblo, ventilate, and layette.

Superintendent Dr. Jennifer Hefner welcomed contestants and guests to Alexander Central Auditorium for the competition. Cristi Julsrud, East Alexander Middle School Teacher, served as the pronouncer. Judges for the event were central office directors Teresa Smeeks and Susan Gantt along with Amy Dawson, Digital Innovation & Learning Specialist for Alexander County Schools. Associate Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction Dr. Betsy Curry assisted Dr. Hefner with presenting the awards.

Payne will advance to the regional competition in Winston-Salem on Sunday, March 18, 2018. ★

Alexander's Castellaw & Godfrey earn top five finishes at NCHSAA 3A Indoor Track Championships

A pair of Alexander Central runners earned top-five finishes at the NCHSAA 3A Indoor Track and Field State Championships held at JDL Fast Track in Winston-Salem on Saturday, February 10.

ACHS senior Bryson Godfrey and sophomore Cooper Castellaw led eight ACHS participants at the state finals with top five finishes in individual events.

Godfrey posted a time of 6:55 to claim fourth place overall in the 3A 55-meter sprint. The senior sprinter added a fifth-place showing in the 300-meter dash with his time of 35.72.

Castellaw posted a pair of personal best times on the way to a fifth place showing in the 3,200-meter run and a sixth place finish in the 1,600-meter run. Castellaw ran a time of 9:39.24 in the 3,200 and a time of 4:25.67 in the 1,600-meter event.

Jesse Schronce, a junior jumper for the Cougars, placed 10th in the high jump

and 25th overall in the triple jump.

In addition to the dual competitors, five more Cougar athletes competed at the finals. Logan Ellis ran to an 11th place finish in the 1,000-meter run with a time of 2:42.28. In hurdles, senior Donovan Smith finished 18th among the men with a time of 8:40 in the 55-meter race.

On the women's side, three ACHS ladies competed on Saturday at JDL. Chesney Price reached 8'6" to place 12th in pole vault, while Sage Harrington placed 14th in triple jump with a distance of 32'5". In throwing, Alexander's Madison Ratchford was 17th overall with a distance of 30'10.5" in the women's shot put. ★

Players will be available following the game for a limited autograph session with general admission ticketholders. VIP ticketholders will enjoy reserved front row seating to the game, a post game reception with the ACC All-Stars, and a photo/autograph session.
