Weekend rain totals reach over 5 inches

The weekend brought spring torrential rains evening hours while Wilbarger County Airport to the area and some hail with amounts of up to five inches of precipitation reported in some gauges, bringing with them a cool down from last week's summer-like temperatures and a respite from extreme drought conditions.

Some wicked weather was reported as winds in excess of 70 mph blew through.

Electricity was lost in parts of Vernon from lightning strikes on Saturday evening. One vehicle reportedly hydroplaned on U.S. 287 from the heavy rain, and slid into the median. One Vernon city street was temporarily closed from a tree falling. Branches and limbs were reported down across town.

The Texas Tech Mesonet site recorded a wind speed of 71 mph in Crowell Saturday

Vernon reported exactly three inches of rain over the weekend, most of it falling during the north of the city received 2.87 inches.

Leading area rainfall totals was the Texas Tech University Mesonet site in Crowell, where 5.66 inches fell and closely behind was the rain gauge at Copper Breaks State Park, which received 5.50 inches, followed by Odell, 1.62 inches; and Goodlett, 1.61 inches. Other weekend rain totals reported across North Texas and Southern Oklahoma included Seymour, 1.66 inches; Wichita Falls, 1.45 inches; Altus, 2.13 inches; and Tipton, 0.87 of an inch.

Pea size hail was reported in southwest Vernon on Saturday night. The National Weather Service confirmed a report of hail near Goodlett in Hardeman County shortly after 8 p.m. Saturday and other hail reports were confirmed in Wichita County in the Electra and Burkburnett areas.

Gunfire outside Dallas police station

DALLAS (AP) — Dallas police officials have advised officers to boost security outside the city's police stations after someone in a vehicle opened fire with a gun near a station.

Police Sgt. Warren Mitchell tells The Dallas Morning News someone was shooting late Saturday night near the city's Central Division station but it's not clear if they were shooting at the police station or in another direction.

He says a security guard at a utility company office in South Dallas also was shot at by someone in a vehicle that matched the description of the one near the police station. Investigators have recovered similar shell casings from both scenes. No one's been reported hurt in the gunfire.

Postal Service issuing scratch-and-sniff stamps

WASHINGTON (AP) — Letter writers will soon be able to express their sentiments in words and

The U.S. Postal Service announced Monday that it will soon issue its first scratch-and-sniff stamps. The stamps feature illustrations of ice pops. The agency says the stamps will "add the sweet scent of summer" to letters.

The 20 stamps depict watercolor illustrations by California artist Margaret Berg. Each of the 10 stamp designs includes two different treats. The words "FOREVER" and "USA" appear along the bottom of each stamp.

The stamps will be issued on June 20 at a children's museum in Austin, Texas.

Rattlesnake bites boy after four-wheeler wreck

GEORGETOWN, Texas (AP) — Authorities in Central Texas say a 12-year-old boy involved in the wreck of a four-wheeler also has been bitten by a rattlesnake.

Few details are available about the incident in Georgetown in Williamson County, just north of

Austin. Williamson County Sheriff Robert Chody says the boy was riding the vehicle when it crashed, and then he was bitten. His condition isn't immediately

known. His name hasn't been released.

Chody says the Texas Department of Public Safety the Texas Department is investigating.

Palace shares family, other wedding photos

LONDON (AP) — Kensington Palace has released three official wedding photographs taken of Prince Harry and the former Meghan Markle shortly after their wedding.

Alexi Lubomirski's images include a family portrait of the couple with Queen Elizabeth II, Prince Charles, Prince William and their spouses, as well as Markle's mother and the children who served as bridesmaids and page boys.

A second image shows the Duke and Duchess of Sussex, as they now are known, just with the

children. The newlyweds also posed for a less formal black and white photo.

The palace said Monday that the pair "feel so lucky to have been able to share their day with all those gathered in Windsor and also all those who watched the wedding on television across the U.K., Commonwealth, and around the world."
