Our staff works together as a team to make sure each patient receives excellent care from check-in to check-out." The list of services for senior adults include: Annual exams, acute and walk-in visits, chronic condition man-

agement, medication management, laboratory services, immunization for flu and pneumonia as well as testing for flu and strep. Gay also notes, "Since we are a part of Owensboro Health Regional Hospital, we also have access to refer our patients into specialty physicians more rapidly, and to refer our cardiac and pulmonology patients to the walk-in clinic that is offered via Owensboro Health."

Providers Braun and Gay, along with Practice Manager Bombard, all currently live in the clinic's service area which means a lot to them. All agree that treating friends, family and neighbors makes what they do seem even more special. "Living in the community where I provide medical services truly helps create deeper-rooted connections and bonds with my neighbors. There is a huge difference in providing care for those we consider our neighbors. Though we provide the same high-level care for everyone, the level of trust from neighbor-to-neighbor is more prominent because I am one of them. I am a part of the community and I understand their values and who they are as individuals. I also feel that many of my patients that are from the area know that I truly care about them as individuals and want what is best for them, their family, friends and our community," Gay said.


