has over forty years experience in business from Seattle, Washington to Playa Del Carmen, Mexico.

Sanders is a musician who started his career performing throughout Canada and Alaska in the 80's.

He began growing and processing coffee in the Yucatan in the 90's. After moving to Florida in 2013, he combined his vast experience in agriculture with with that of his brother-in-law in Maroon Town, Jamaica. There the family owns a six-acre farm on which they grow chocolate. Sanders has a direct hand in its growing, harvesting and producing chocolate as well as a special drink from only Jamaica called CocoTea.

Jamaican Chocolate, grown by Andrew and his family, is unadulterated and delicious. They

have perfected a dark chocolate that they can combine with other flavors and fruits. No other taste like theirs can be found in the region.

Sanders will be spending several days each week, in the gallery, make chocolate and chocolate creations. The bowls he makes can be filled with many different creams and mousses, to share at parties. Artists in the Flamingo Clay Studio will be making teapots and cups for his specialty drink, CocoTea. Once he is fully set up in the gallery, he will be able to cast your children's hands and make chocolate replicas for their parties.

This chocolate, as beautiful as it looks, is meant to be eaten. Stop by for a chat and a chocolate bowl, or chocolate rose petals. Sanders will be making his chocolate creations through dem-
