Transition To Life Academy Graduates 28 Students

LAKE WORTH – Nearly 100 family members, friends and other supporters showed up for the graduation of 28 Transition to Life Academy students at

the Scottish Rite Masonic Center on D Street Friday, June 1.

The Transition to Life Academy is the tuitionfree public charter school of Gulfstream Goodwill Academies, operated by Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, serving youth 18 to 21 years old with intellectual disabilities.



"Today isn't just about graduation day, it's about what you're going to do next... taking what you've learned and putting your full abilities to work for a happy life," said Gulfstream Goodwill Industries President and featured speaker Marvin A. Tanck.

Tanck has been with the Goodwill family for 44 years and will be retiring at the end of the year. He has seen more than 364 students graduate from the school since its opening in 2004.

This is the fifth year that the Scottish Rite has provided space for the school to hold its student graduation ceremony and luncheon. The Scottish Rite also provides space for the school to hold special events, such as their student Valentine's Day dance, throughout the year.

"We are so very grateful for the relationship our school has with the Scottish Rite," said Director of Charter Schools Cindy Maunder.
"They are supportive of our students

and we appreciate that so much. Community partnerships like these are very important to our school's success."

Transition to Life academy students in training programs receive a daily stipend and transportation is provided. The school's mission is to provide the skills necessary for adult life so that each



individual will be an independent, self-sufficient and contributing member of our community. The school is located in Boynton Beach.

Registration Still Open for Grant-Funded Programs

Registration is still open for grant-funded programs at five magnet schools including two International Baccalaureate (I.B.) elementary schools, one I.B. middle school, one established I.B. middle school with STEM infusion, and one STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) middle school.

The five schools and grant-funded programs are:

- Carver Middle School, Delray Beach: IB Middle Years Programme with STEM infusion
- Congress Middle School, Boynton Beach: STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics)
- Grove Park Elementary, Palm Beach Gardens: IB Primary Years Programme with STEM infusion
- H.L. Watkins Middle School, Palm Beach Gardens: IB Middle Years

• Palmetto Elementary School, West Palm Beach: IB Primary Years Programme with STEM infusion

Students in MSAP grant-funded programs will have personal iPads and other opportunities unique to their schools, including collaborating with local artists on murals and participating in STEM and STEAM nights. Teachers in the schools will receive extensive professional development paid for by the grant, to create some of the most highly qualified teachers in the District.
