There was dancing and bounce housing and a lot of joy.

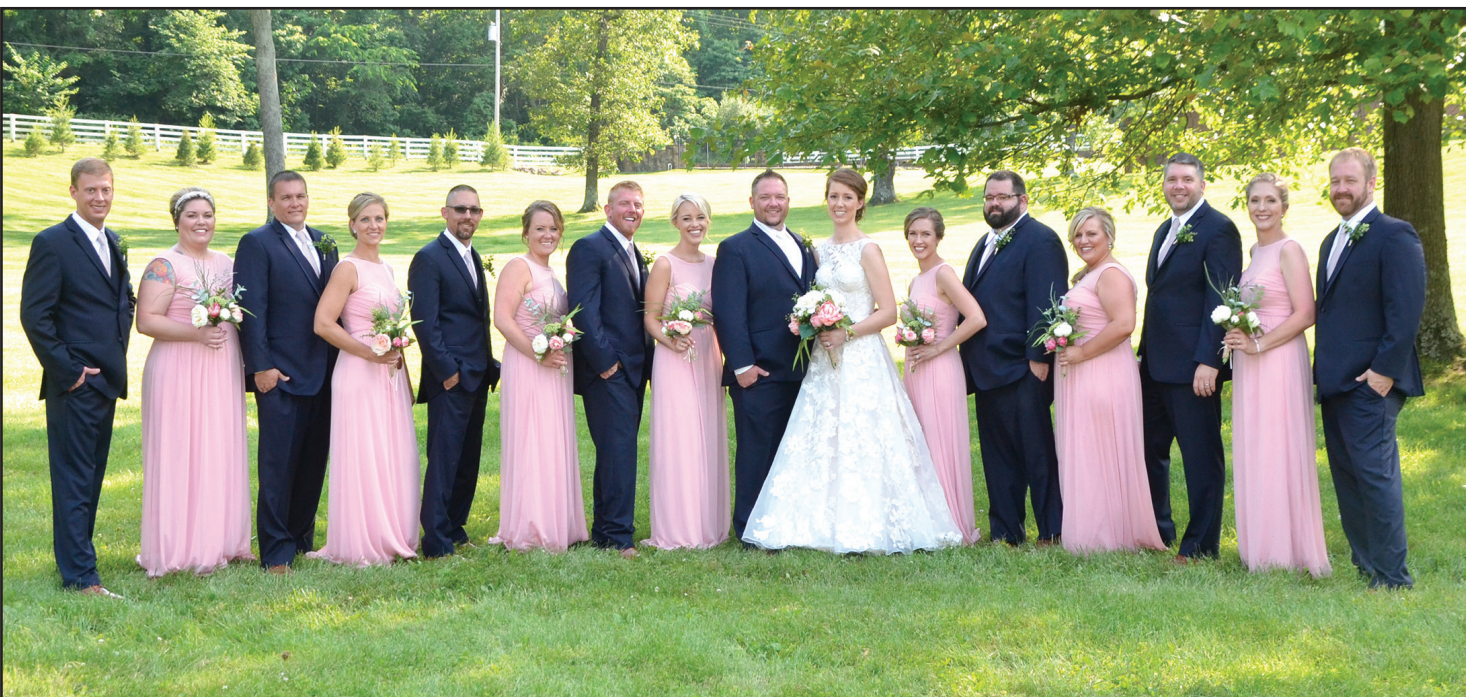
It was everything they had hoped and dreamed the day would be.
