

What's Happening at the 4-H Fair

From rabbits to rockets, there will be something enticing for all ages at the Spencer County 4-H Fair, set for Wednesday- Tuesday, June 20 - 26 — a full week of fun for everyone!

This smoke-free, family friendly event showcases projects 4-Hers have worked on for months, honing new skills and learning much along the way.

A full schedule of events is included in this special section.

Wednesday, June 20

From 4 to 7 p.m., Consumer Clothing and Sewing projects will be judged in the Youth and Community Center Building. Following the judging at 7:30 p.m. enjoy a fashion revue.

The Spencer County 4-H Ambassador Contest will be held at 7 p.m. Contestants will be asked a question during the competition. Winners will be selected from each category — Senior, Junior, Young, Mini — based on how they answer the question. The ambassadors will assist with events throughout the fair.

Thursday, June 21

This is an evening for checking in — as in project check-in — scheduled between 5 and 8 p.m. 4-H Horse and Pony check-in will be held at 6 p.m.



Friday, June 22

The day starts with livestock check in from 7-10 a.m. with chess at 9 a.m. Enjoy a STEM makers demo from 1-3 p.m. The 4-H Fair opens to the public at 4 p.m. Exhibits will be ready for viewing in the Exhibit Hall.



At 5:30 p.m. enjoy Deal or No Deal, based on the TV program, which will be held in the YCC building. Make sure to grab a ticket when you arrive for a chance to play. The goat show and judging will be held in the livestock arena at 6

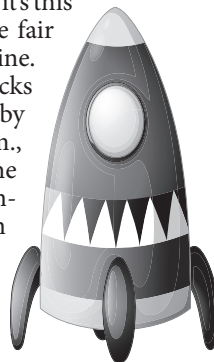
p.m. and an archery public demonstration will also be held at 6 p.m. Shooting Sports 4-H Club will give a public demonstration displaying members' accomplishments and abilities in the lower level building, behind the YCC building, at 6 p.m.

At 7 p.m., tractor and truck pulls will commence on the tractor pull track. But for those who prefer horses and ponies, the Grand Entrance will be held at 7 p.m., followed by the 4-H Horse Contest at 7:30 p.m. Also at 7 p.m., magician Brandon Baggett will perform in the YCC building.

Saturday, June 23

From 6:30-9:30 a.m. it's this little piggy went to the fair — time to check in swine.

The rocket launch kicks off at 8 a.m. followed by the cat show at 9 a.m., held simultaneous to the Robotics Club demonstration and the open rabbit show. The Horse and Pony Versatility Class is set for 9:30 a.m., followed by the



sheep show at 10 a.m. After a break, the dog show will be held on the tennis courts at noon at the same time as the Garden Fun contest. Garden Fun entries will be accepted in the YCC building until noon. Bring your biggest veggies, snake skin and more! The baby contest is set for 1 p.m. followed by Silly Safaris Live Animal Show at 4 p.m., the poultry show at 5 p.m., another Silly Safaris show at 5:30 p.m., the Open National Barrel Association Horse Show at 6 p.m. and a public demonstration rifle shoot, also at 6 p.m. The evening concludes with tractor pulls at 7 p.m. as well as the swine show, to be held at the same time.

Sunday, June 24

Antique Tractors will be on display all day.

At 9 a.m., a worship service will take place in the YCC building.

Chicken dinners will be served from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m. in the YCC building. Dinners include

two pieces of chicken, mashed potatoes with gravy, green beans, slaw, bread and a drink. You won't want to miss the frog jumping contest at 11 a.m. or the horse and pony clean and grooming contest at the same time. At noon, enjoy the rabbit show as well as Safety Sam ATV.

At 1 p.m., 10-year and last-year member awards will be presented along with Grand Champions in the YCC building. The 4-H Cloggers will perform after



the awards at 2 p.m. and Mud Volleyball will commence at the same time on the tractor pull track. Sign-ups will begin a little before; the event is open to the public. There is a \$20 entry fee. Winners will receive a 50% payback. Also at 2 p.m. will be the Pet Parade, and the Kiddie Tractor Pulls, presented by the South Spencer FFA will take place on the tennis courts commencing at 3 p.m. All participants will receive a ribbon. The Chrisney Fire Department will also conduct a Child Obstacle Course at 3 p.m.

The 4-H Horse Show (halter and performance) will take place in the horse arena at 4 p.m. The Dairy Show and judging will be in the livestock arena at 6 p.m. and the Beef Show at 6:30 p.m.

Monday, June 25

It's a day to kick back and relax, sort of. A Table Tennis tourney is set for 9 a.m. followed by a Monopoly Tourney at noon. Small animal livestock photos will be taken from 12-2 p.m., followed by large animal photos from 2-4 p.m. The BBQ contest will also be held at 2 p.m. A buyer's meal for the livestock auction will take place in the YCC building at 4:30 p.m. with herdsman awards given out in the livestock arena at 5:45 p.m., both the 4-H Horse Fun Show and Livestock Auction at 6 p.m., and release of projects starting at 7 p.m.

Tuesday, June 26

This day is set for clean up at 7 a.m. with breakfast provided afterwards for participants.
