North Spencer County School Corporation Back to School Information 2018

First day of school in North Spencer County School Corporation will be Wednesday, August 15, and is a full day.

North Spencer County School Corporation principals are in their offices beginning on July 27, and residents who have moved into the school corporation during the summer months are urged to register school-aged children in August. Call the school your child will be attending for an appointment. Parents will need to bring a birth certificate and immunization records with them at the time of registration. A student cannot be registered without these two items (this is state law).

incipal, Jeff Cochren is the assistant principal. Call any of the schools for further information.

Breakfast and lunch will be served on August 15.

The elementary schools serve breakfast from 7:20 to 7:40 a.m.

Breakfast at the Middle and High School is from 7:30 to 7:50 a.m.

Prices for elementary school lunches will be \$2.10, middle-senior high school lunch prices will be \$2.35.

Breakfast is available at David Turnham Education Center, Nancy Hanks Elementary, Chrisney Elementary and Lincoln Trail Elementary; cost is \$1.55.

Breakfast is also available at Heritage Hills High School and Heritage Hills Middle School for \$1.85.

Adults may purchase breakfast for \$2.45, lunch for \$3.25.

Families who qualify for free meals can receive breakfast and lunch meals at no cost.

A family qualifying for reduced priced meals will pay \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch.

Textbook rental fees vary at each of the six schools in the corporation and vary by grade level. All Heritage Hills Middle and High School students pay book rental fees at the time of registration. Elementary school book rental fees will be given to students at pre-registration or on the first day of school and are due within the first two weeks of school.

Guidelines and application forms for free textbooks and free and reduced lunches are on line, or on

file in the offices of all schools. These forms will be updated and available in each building on July 27.

Families who feel they may need assistance with meals and textbook rental may file a 2018-2019 Household Application for Free and Reduced Price School Meals. Only one application needs to be filled out for each family even if the children attend different schools. Instructions and applications for meal and textbook assistance are available in each school office, on each school's website and are also available in the students' Harmony registration packet. Forms must be filled out completely before they can be processed. Any application with missing information will be returned for completion. Once completed and turned in, a family should expect a response within 10 days. If you do not receive a timely response please contact Mary Waninger at 812-937-2400 ext. 2003.

Families who have been pre-approved for free meals due to SNAP, FDPIR or TANF or Other Source Category were notified in a letter in July. If you feel you should have received this notice please contact Mary Waninger at 812-937-2400 ext. 2003

David Turnham back to school

David Turnham is located in Dale and has approximately 285 students in grades kindergarten through six with an additional 24 students enrolled in preschool. The principal is Mrs. Jennifer Jazyk. The staff consists of 25 full and part time certified, licensed teachers, two licensed social workers, nine teaching assistants and a secretary, Jamie Watkins. The preschool school staff includes one certified teacher, and two assistants. The cafeteria staff consists of three cooks. The school offers a daily lunch and breakfast program, preschool for 3-5 year olds, a Title I program in grades K-6, and ENL program for student in K-6, Robotics, Academic Bowl, Band, Chorus, Art Club, before and after school daycare, and a very active Parent-Teacher organization. The school also offers a fitness trail in its outdoor lab, strong after-school programs, is a designated UPGRADE school and is located near the public library. Registration and Open House

Registration for the 2018-2019 school year will be held Thursday, August 2 from 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Wednesday, August 8, from 12 - 3 p.m. At that time, parents may pay book fees and update emergency information. Parents needing access to the internet may also complete the registration process online during these times in the school's learning lab.

An Open House will be held on Wednesday, August 8 from 6 - 7 p.m., beginning in the gym with a brief PTEO meeting and then open up the classrooms for visiting with teachers. The learning lab will be open if you need access to devices for online registration and the office

will be open for you to pay fees.

New Students

Parents of students who have never been enrolled in the David Turnham attendance area should arrange to enroll their child by contacting the school at 812-937-2400 ext. 6 or at jjazyk@nspencer.k12.in.us as soon as possible. Regular office hours are kept from 8 - 3 p.m. most days after August 1. Parents are required to bring a birth certificate and immunization records. Kindergarten students who have moved to the area are required to have their immunization records, birth certificate and social security number.

Book and Lunch Fees

Book rental should be paid prior to the start of school, during registration times or within the first week of school. The child will receive his/her book fees in the principal's summer letter, during online registration, and if not before, in the first Thursday Folder for the school year. Breakfast is \$1.55 and lunch is \$2.10. Lunch accounts should also be established prior to August 15. You may pay online or drop cash or check off during registration times. Make lunch checks to North Spencer Cafe and checks for textbooks to David Turnham.

School Hours and 2018-2019 Calendar

Students are able to enter the building at 7:25 a.m. Breakfast and morning fitness run from 7:25 - 7:45 a.m. School begins at 7:50 a.m. and ends at 3 p.m. The first day of the 2018-2019 school year is Wednesday, August 15, and the last day will be Friday, May 24. Preschool

Preschool is offered for 3-4 year olds from 8 - 11 a.m. and for 4-5 year olds from 12 - 3 p.m. An optional full day program/daycare is offered,

too. Registration is required. Currently the school's full day program is full, but we there is space for those looking for preschool only. Please call to reserve a spot in this program, be put on the waiting list or to inquire about fees.

2018-2019 School Supply List

Please bring supplies to open house or on the first day of school.

Preschool: One folder, eight glue sticks, eight black dry erase markers, colored construction paper, backpack.

Kindergarten: Two boxes of Crayola crayons, four glue sticks, eight black dry erase markers, two, two-pocket folders, one family size box of tissues, one pack of pink erasers, backpack.

Grade 1: One package of dry erase markers, two boxes of tissues, \$10 and a backpack.

Grade 2: Backpack, school box, scissors, two glue sticks, box of 24 crayons, four dry erase markers, two, three-prong folders, 10 yellow No. 2 pencils, two large erasers, two notebooks, two boxes of tissues, earbuds or headphones.

Grade 3: One pair of earbuds or headphones, \$10 and a backpack.

Grade 4: Two boxes of tissues, one pair of earbuds, one package of dry erase markers, \$10 and a backpack.

Grade 5: One pair of earbuds or headphones, two boxes of tissues, \$10 and a backpack.

Grade 6: One pair of earbuds or headphones, three pocket folders, one pack of 5 divider tab sheets, one package of notebook paper (not opened), two four-packs of Post-Its, two boxes of tissues, four spiral notebook (70 pages), simple calculator, four dry erase markers, school box with: glue, two blue pens, pencils, crayons and colored pencils, three composition notebooks and

a student planner (Dollar Tree carries these).
