Students and/or parents will be required to contact their school bus driver or phone the school bus garage at 812-649-4456 if for any reason they will not be riding the school bus to school on a regular basis. Failure to contact driver or school bus garage will result in termination of bus stop at your location.

All students within city limits and/or subdivisions will be picked up at intersections. Stops will not be made at individual houses. Exceptions will be made for special needs students only.

Note: Route changes will not be made without preapproval through the school bus garage.
