St. Bernard Catholic School has approximately 150 students in preschool through eighth grade. The school offers accredited, fulland part-time preschool and prekindergarten programs. There are limited spaces available in preschool and prekindergarten; call the preschool office, 812-649-4417, for more information. First day of school is Thursday, August 2. School begins at 7:55 a.m.

St. Bernard's principal is Beth Strodel, and the school's administrative assistant is Connie Folz. St. Bernard preschool's director is Lisa Cook, and the lead teacher is Lindsay Rutherford. There are 24 faculty and staff members.

**Meal Program** 

The school offers daily breakfast and lunch programs, before- and afterschool child care, clubs, sports, and has an active Parent-Teacher Organization. Bus service is available.

### Supply lists Kindergarten

The brands listed are recommendations based on many years of experience. Please label the following items with your child's

One box of eight large (not jumbo) Crayola crayons; one box of 24-count Crayola crayons; eight Elmer's glue sticks (we go through many glue sticks and the beforeschool prices are the cheapest all year); one bottle of Elmer's glue; one pair of Fiskar children's scissors (blunt or pointed tip); one large Pink Pearl eraser (pencils will be provided by the teacher); one large book bag – a backpackstyle bag with a zipper works well, your child should be able to open and close it on his or her own; one towel – to keep in backpack to use as a rest mat; one complete set of extra clothes in a labeled gallon zip-top bag - should include a shirt, pants, underwear and socks.

Please do not label the following items as they will be shared by the class.

One box of Kleenex; one container of Baby wipes or Clorox wipes.

Note: Tabletop caddies are used to hold the children's supplies, so you do not need to provide a school box.

# **Ready for school at Lincoln Trail Elementary**

### **School Hours**

Students will be able to enter the building at 7:20 a.m. School begins at 7:40 a.m. and ends at 3 p.m. The first day of the 2018-2019 school year is Wednesday, August 15, and the last day will be Friday, May 24. A complete North Spencer calendar can be found at www.nspencer.k12.in.us/.

### Preschool

Preschool is offered for 3-4 year-olds from 8 - 11 a.m. and for 4-5 year-olds from 12 - 3 p.m. An optional full day program/day care is offered, too. Registration is required. Please call to reserve a spot in this program or to inquire about fees.

### After School Care

Lincoln Trail Elementary will once again offer after school care for students in grades Preschool-6 until 6 p.m. each day. There are no set participation criteria. The fee will remain the same as in the previous school year. Please call for details.

### **Book Rental and Meal Fees**

Book rental should be paid prior to the start of school, during registration times, or within the first week of school. Breakfast is \$1.55 and lunch is \$2.05. Lunch accounts should also be established by August 10.


Preschool: One folder, eight glue sticks, eight black dry erase markers, colored construction paper, backpack.
