So be sure to wave at Daryl and June Lovell on Saturday, September 8, when they represent their community as Grand Marshals of the Dale Fall Festival Parade.


Daryl Lovell — Dale historian

Well over 25 years ago, Daryl Lovell was inspired! He had seen a newly printed Chrisney history book titled "Our Hoosier Heritage, 1865-1987" and got in contact with Eugenia Groves to discover how members of his neighboring community went about collecting and writing its history.

He had some scraps but was not in possession of the whole cloth.

His great-aunt and -uncle, Grace and Bob Brown gifted him with bits and pieces of some of O.V. Brown's materials (O.V. is Daryl's great-great-uncle). This treasure included letters, photos, negatives, a book on Andersonville Prison, old papers and news articles. He was also able to borrow over 2,700 images, both photos and negatives, amassed by O.V. and to digitize them.

This memorabilia formed the basis for the book Daryl wrote with Ellen Winkler Rexing for Dale's Sesquicentennial in 1993 entitled "Dale 1843-1993." He is currently updating the book for Dale's 175th birthday this year, to be celebrated during the Dale Fall Festival September 6-8.
