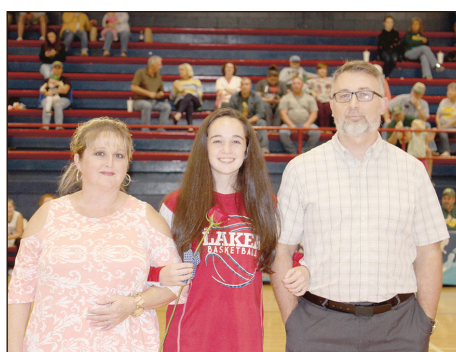

someone or a business in their community that donates funds specifically earmarked for uniform purchases to encourage membership and ease the burden of financial disposition." While the Russell County Honor Guard does not have a similar program, they can assist in linking Veterans with the distributors to purchase one. A uniform will typically cost between \$200-\$400 but if these issues are a concern, every effort will be given to assist in diverting the costs.

"I cannot stress enough the importance of this program. The HonorGuard over the years has been involved in supporting

our community in various ways. It would be a great loss to Russell County to see it fail simply due to lack of willing Veterans." The local HonorGuard averages 25 funerals a year, a decrease over past years due in part to losing most of our World War II Veterans. As time goes by, we will want to honor our Vietnam Veterans in their passing and the need for a HonorGuard will be great. Jail \$1,069,413.91, LGEA \$13,623.78, ASAP \$98,361.00, Grants \$0, Tourism \$22,618.38, Dispatch \$192,511.08, Airport \$30,728.59, Airport Project \$3,848.11, DFC \$12,101.21, Airport Board \$35,336.44 and ABC \$44,927.89. The total of all funds was \$449,277.89.

A transfer of \$10,000 to repay start up costs from the ABC fund to the General fund was unanimously approved.

A memorandum of agreement was approved for the renewal of the Rocket Docket Program with the Commonwealth Attorney.

An inter-local road agreement renewal between the Fiscal Court and the City of Jamestown was approved unanimously.

A vote for the approval of an Ambulance Grant Fund award in the amount of \$10,000.00 was passed.

Judge Executive Gary Robertson reported that

the Flex Resolution and Memorandum Agreement for \$202,860 of state funds to be used for road repair has been received and was approved by the Court.

Funds received from alcohol sales for the month of August totalled \$18,450.55 with \$4096.76 distributed to the City of Jamestown.

Brittany Luttrell requested a sign to be placed in the county in recognition of the 2018 Little Miss and Mr. Kentucky Tahlon Luttrell and Hallie Knight and it was decided that a sign would be placed at the entrance of the Russell County Fairgrounds.

Other items on the agenda included the second reading of the partial closure of Foley Rd. and discussion of the fencing of the end of Pettyjohn Rd.
