TOWN OF GOODMAN CURFEW ORDINANCE

An ordinance imposing curfew upon all persons within the corporate limits on the Town of Goodman, Mississippi, who are sixteen and under, between the hours of **8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.**, and who are not in the company of their parent or guardian or are without possession of written permission of their parent or guardian within such hours to be upon the public right of way of said Town of Goodman for lawful purpose, and defining the responsibility of the parent or guardian for the actions of the child and imposing penalty for violation of same.

Section 1. This ordinance is adopted to address the expressed concerns of the citizenry of the Town of Goodman, Mississippi, as to persons sixteen (16) and under roaming the streets at hours of late night and early morning, creating general disturbance toward property and the peace of law abiding property adjoining the same, and for the proper protection of minors in said municipality and providing for defined responsibility of the parent or guardian of any child found in violation hereof.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person sixteen (16) and under to be found upon any public right of way in the Town of Goodman, Mississippi, between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. from Sunday through Saturday, **and also during school hours from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** unless such person is in the company of his parents or guardian, or unless such person has in his possession a written and dated authorization of his parent or guardian to be so situated for such lawful purpose as stated in the written authorization.

Section 3. The parent, parents, or legal guardian of any child found within the confines of Goodman, Mississippi, in violation of this ordinance, are hereby held responsible for the actions of their children. Any such parent, parents or legal guardian of a child found in violation of this ordinance, shall upon proper proof, be included in affidavit for contributing to the delinquency of such minor and properly afforded trial in the Municipal Court of the Town of Goodman, Mississippi. The law enforcement officers within the Town of Goodman and Holmes County, Mississippi, will first warn the guardian and/or parent or parents, by use of Exhibit A, attached hereto, and thereafter, law enforcement may charge the guardian and/or parent or parents after having been warned of the minor's violation.

Section 4. Any child found in violation of this ordinance shall be properly referred to the Youth Court of Holmes County, Mississippi, for such action therein as to said child as that court may take.

Section 5. **PENALTY PROVISIONS.** Any child found in violation of this ordinance, on due proof presented, shall have imposed upon him or her such penalty as the Youth Court of Holmes County may impose.

Any parent, parents, or legal guardian of such child found in violation of this ordinance, after a warning, shall upon conviction have imposed upon him or her a fine not exceeding \$100.00 for the first offense, \$200.00 for the second offense, and \$1,000.00 for the third offense, and/or ninety days in the County jail, pursuant to Section 21-13-1 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

Section 6. Due to the present situation existing in this municipality and the necessity to immediately protect the peace, health and safety of its citizens, both adults and minors, this ordinance shall take effect immediately and remain in full force and effect for a period ending as such date in the future as this situation improves, to support repeal of same by the proper officials of the Town of Goodman, Mississippi, same being an emergency ordinance.

This ordinance having first reduced to writing was considered and adopted first by sections, whereupon on motion of **Alderman Elijah Brooks** and seconded by **Alderman Sandra Young**, the ordinance was adopted by unanimous vote of the Aldermen as follows:

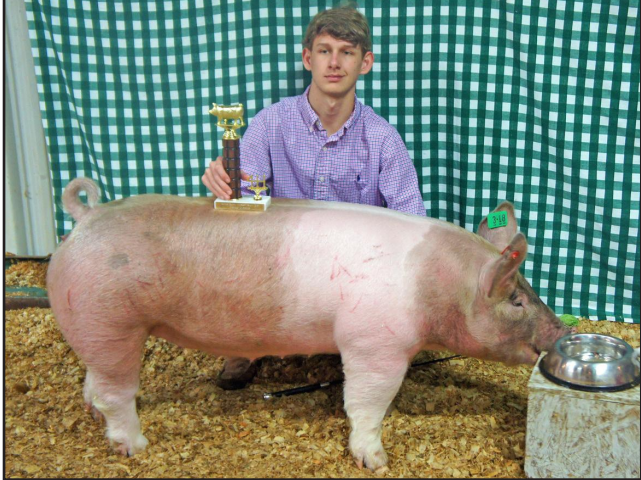
