

Chester White Market Hogs showed next with Lilly/Bennett/Emma Word placing 2nd with their lightweight. Grayson Marshall, then, placed 5th with his middleweight. Wes Melton and Alex Arnold, showing heavyweights placed 4th and 5th, respectively, to finish up the Friday part of the Market Hog show. On Saturday, the final five

breeds of the Market hogs were shown. In the Duroc breed division, Natalie and Nicole Winstead both placed 2nd in their separate weight class divisions. John/Chloe Word placed 11th and Hanna Hood 12th with their lightweights. Cailey McBride took 10th in middleweights, and Pearce Edwards stood 13th with his heavyweight. In the Yorkshire division, John Hudson/Chloe Word placed 3rd in the Mississippi Bred group. In the Hampshire division, John Thomas Murtagh placed 1st, Lilly Word 2nd, and Hanna Hood, 3rd, with MS Bred lightweights. In middleweights, Bennett/Lilly/Emma Word placed 2nd MS Bred and Cailey Mc-Bride took 12th. John Thomas Murtagh finished up the heavyweight division placing 1st with his MS Bred Hamp. Showing Percentage Simmental bulls, Tyler Diffey's Rockie reigned Supreme winning this overall honor in his breed division. Also, placing well with Percentage Simmental bulls were Maeson Jolley winning his class and Pearce Jayce Eldridge of Montgom-Edwards placing 2nd.
