This plan would ensure that the "teams" were different from game to game, every child would participate, every child would play both with and "against" every other child, and most important, the children would manage their own play. tor/entrepreneur Ned Johnson argue that the child and teen anxiety and depression epidemics are largely due to parental over-involvement and micromanagement in everything from children's social lives to their homework. Today's kids simply do not enjoy enough control over their time and activities. They are so thoroughly managed from waking to bedtime (the authors also point out that today's teens are not getting enough sleep, a factor that greatly increases their emotional vulnerability) that they don't even know how to make good decisions when it comes to spare time, which goes a long way toward explaining why so many of them - especially boys spend so much of what little time they can control playing

addictive video games. Having adequate control over one's life is essential to feeling competent and developing emotional resilience as well as the sort of coping skills that are essential to dealing functionally with disappointment, frustration and failure - inevitable aspects of life. Stixrud and Johnson have written a book that every parent should read and heed.
