Tchula ordered to pay state auditor delinquent fees

The Mississippi Office of the State Auditor is warning four local governments to pay their delinquent court assessments fees within 30 days, or face consequences.

Court assessment fees collected from misdemeanor offenses and traffic violations are required by law to be deposited with the state treasurer every month. The towns of Raleigh and Tchula (CHOO'-luh), the city of Shaw and Coahoma County each have not properly appropriated between \$14,000 and \$69,000 in court assessment fees to the state treasurer.

State Auditor Stacey Pickering alerted the four local governments Monday, March 12, that they will receive formal demands if they do not appropriate their feeds within 30 days. Such demands, not yet issued, could lead to legal action.

A Psalm of David tells us, "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name."



habitually lie can breathe that "My Child Is an Honor a huge sigh of relief – The New York Times says that budding Pinocchios are more intelligent than kids who tell the truth ("Is Your Child Lying to You? That's Good," Alex Stone, January 5, 2018). The Grey Lady's announcement is based on studies done in the 1980s in which young children who disobeyed an instruction and then denied having disobeved were discovered to have higher IQs than those who admitted disobedience. A subsequent study found that most adults cannot tell when children are lying, a finding that seems – on the surface, at least – to confirm the previous study.

The question, of course, becomes: Does perfecting the art of lying make a child smarter or does being smart lend itself to lying? Which comes first, dishonesty or a high IQ? Your author will not attempt to unravel that puzzle. I will, however, mention that people who habitually lie are known as sociopaths. So, whereas the NYT sees it as good news that some children become inveterate liars at an early age, teaching a child to lie in the hopes he or she will become smarter as a result is not recommended. Unfortunately, today's parenting culture seems to put a higher premium on a high IQ than it does morality. Consider that one regularly sees bumper stickers advertising children's academic
