These horrible cases underline the need for common sense solutions to better protect our pets throughout the county.

Even though there are no tethering laws in the state, pet owners can follow the tethering rules for the humane treatment of dogs by tethering them in a safe, thoughtful way.

The proper way of tethering an animal is as follows:

- 1. The chain should be three times the length of the animal;
- 2. Food, water and shelter must be provided. The water bowl should never be empty and

changed daily;

- 3. The animal should be released from the chain daily in order to get the proper exercise
- 4. The surroundings should be cleaned daily and the shelter sanitized on a regular basis.

These rules should be followed and endorsed by authorities throughout the county. There is a need for our authorities to get involved in helping to educate the public on humane treatment of animals before careless actions lead to a pet's demise or to aggression that would cause harm to citizens of Holmes County.

Studies show that dogs tethered for long periods of time, become highly aggressive and when confronted with a threat, a tethered dog often feels forced to attack. Unfortunately, children are the most common victims of dog attacks. Seventy percent of attacks happen when a chained dog lashes out.

We encourage our authorities to enforce the ordinances prohibiting certain breeds within municipal limits of Holmes County.


