Unemployment rate near historic low and jobs near historic high Mississippi's unemploy-

ment rate in May 2018 was 4.7%, the third lowest level of unemployment ever recorded in Mississippi.

The April rate is one-tenth of a percentage point higher than a month earlier in May 2018, when the rate was 4.6% and six-tenths of a percentage point lower than a year ago in May 2017, when the rate was 5.3%.

The Labor Force, which is made up of everyone who has a job or is looking for a job, increased in May by 2,900 to 1,278,200. Over the year since May 2017, the Labor Force fell by 3,500.

The number of people working in Mississippi rose in May by 1,600 to 1,218,700. For the year since increased (Photos submitted) by 1,300 in May to 59,500;
