Farm Service Agency county committee nomination period in Holmes County to began June 15

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) encourages America’s farmers and ranchers to nominate candidates to lead, serve and represent their community on their local county committee. According to USDA’s Farm Service Agency (FSA)

Holmes County Executive Director Jim Corley, FSA will accept nominations for county committee members beginning Friday, June 15, 2018.

Producers across the country are already serving on committees where they play a critical role in the day-to-day operations of FSA, making important decisions on programs dealing with disaster and conservation, emergencies, commodity loan price support, county office employment and other agricultural issues.

“County committees are unique to FSA and allow producers to have a voice on federal farm program implementation at the local level,” said Corley. “It is also important that committees are comprised of members who fairly represent the diverse demographics of production agriculture for their community. I encourage all producers, including women, minority and beginning farmers

and ranchers, to participate in the nomination and election process.”

Nationwide, more than 7,700 dedicated farmers and ranchers serve on FSA county committees, which consist of three to 11 members and meet once a month, or as needed. Members serve three-year terms.

Producers can nominate themselves or others. Organizations, including those representing beginning, women and minority producers, may also nominate candidates to better serve their communities. To be eligible to serve on an FSA county committee, producers must participate or cooperate in an FSA program and reside in the area where the election is being held.

This year, nominations and elections for Holmes County will be held in local administrative area 2, which includes the communities of Coxburg, Ebenezer, Goodman, Pickens and South Lexington.

There will be a public meeting concerning the COC election process on Wednesday, June 27th at the Lexington USDA Service Center and will begin at 2:00 PM. The office is located across from the John Deere dealership. Persons with

A delegation of Holmes County senior 4-H’ers recently returned from State 4-H Club Congress. This three day event is held annually on the Mississippi State University campus and is the state event for “elite” 4-H’ers to represent and compete in their project areas for their counties at the state level of competition.

Representing Holmes County were: Tyler Branch, Tyler Diffey, Pearce Edwards, Livi Howell, Lindsey Huffman, Janawa McCaskill II, John Thomas Murtagh and Davian Powell.

These youth competed in a variety of project areas and did exceptionally well. Those excelling in this year’s event were members of the Livestock Bowl team: Tyler Branch, Tyler Diffey, Pearce Edwards and Davian Powell. These guys placed 2nd in the STATE with Tyler Diffey receiving 2nd place high point overall individual and being defeated by the Hinds County team by one point. (We have done well in the past, but never achieved this level through the competition that was fielded in this year’s contest.)

In another stiff competition, Tractor Driving, Davian

took 4th, and John Thomas, 6th. Janawa competed in the Consumer Judging contest, Livi and Lindsey competed in Interior Design and Tyler Branch presented a visual presentation on Meat Goats. State 4-H Club Congress is the state contest competition for senior 4-H’ers only. Project Achievement Day is the junior 4-H contest competition day and it will be held July 12, at Moorhead on the campus of Mississippi Delta Community College.

Upcoming for next week is the North State Cookout Contest. This event will be held in Winona on June 26, at the Montgomery County Coliseum. Holmes County will be well represented by an eager group of junior 4-H’ers competing in the Pork and Beef competitions. The State 4-H Horse Championships will be going on this week (June 20-23) at the Fordice Equine Expo building on the Fairgrounds in Jackson. Halter classes will be exhibited on Friday; all speed will be run on Saturday. The building is cool and parking is plentiful.
