pick what is right for you. The manufacturer will suggest a line size best suited for that particular fly rod. I would advise using lightweight line. For example, if you have a rod designed for 5 to 7 weight line, try a 5 weight line. A double taper or weight forward taper in a floating line will give you the most versatility and will also simplify casting. Manufactured leaders

come in various lengths and sizes and are a matter of personal preference. For bluegill, match the length of vour leader to the length of your rod. The leader should be tapered and the tippet should be somewhere in the 3 to 6 pound test size. Because of the expense of manufactured leaders, it would be wise to purchase tippet material in the same test size as your leader. gets down to the heavier test, you can simply tie on piece of the tippet material to make your leader its original length, rather than replacing the leader.

Effective flies for bluegill include popping bugs, wet flies, and nymphs, in various insect patterns, and a few dry flies. Remember that bluegill have small mouths, so flies in 12 to 20 hook sizes work best. The best colors are black, olivegreen, and brown.


